Homeowners Tap Sample Collection Procedure

Sampling Instructions

These Samples are being collected to determine the lead and copper levels in your tap water. This sampling effort is required by the US Environmental Protection Agency and your state, and is being accomplished through the cooperation of homeowners and residents.

Collect samples from a tap that has not been used for a minimum of 6 hours. Because of this requirement, the best time to collect samples is either early in the morning or in the evening upon returning from work. Be sure to use taps that have been in general use by your household for the past few months.

Sampling Instructions:

1. Prior arrangements will be made with the customer to coordinate the sample collection event. Dates will be set for sample kit delivery and pick-up by water department staff.
2. There must be a minimum of 6 hours during which there is no water used from the tap the sample is taken from and any taps adjacent or close to that tap. The water department recommends that either early mornings or evenings upon returning home are the best sampling times to ensure that the necessary stagnant water conditions exist.
3. A kitchen or bathroom cold-water faucet is to be used for sampling. If you have water softeners on your kitchen taps, collect your sample from the bathroom tap that is not attached to a water softener, if possible. **Do not remove the aerator prior to sampling.** Place the opened sample bottle below the faucet and gently open the cold water tap. **Fill the sample bottle to the 1000mL Line on the side of the bottle** and turn off the water. **MUST FILL TO 1000mL Line on side of bottle or the sample will be rejected.**
4. Tightly cap the sample bottle and place in the sample kit provided. Please review the sample kit label at this time to ensure that all information contained on the label is correct.
